I am the only familymember who has not been incarcerated and I know first hand the addedweight of financial burdens added on while people are incarcerated. It is defeating as people struggle with thousands of dollars in latefees, interest, fines and obstacles that often lead toreincarceration.

This pilot offers an opportunity for families to access a legal structure that puts financial obligations and benefits on hold to avoid a bad credithistory or accruing unnecessary additional debt. It provides navigating Investing upfront will save money in the long run and reduce the numbers of people incages in our country.

The majority of people incarcerated in Oregon willreturn to the community at some point. Having them read a book onwhat to do is clearly not enough. People being released often can'tread at a third grade level. This project offers the support needed to remove financial and other obstacles that often prevent people from successfully returning to their communities.
