

- Governor's priorities
 - o Ensure Oregonians have clean air and water
- The responsibility of the Columbia River Gorge Commission is to act as the primary regional planning agency for non-federal lands within the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area.
 - This requires the Commission to create, coordinate, and implement decisions that will support the regional economy and protect the Scenic Area's natural resources.

Agency Overview





- Agency's emerging issues
 - Staff Capacity
 - Agency staff was reduced during the recession and has not returned to pre-recession levels.
 - ▼ The agency is required to review the Gorge Management Plan and to push forward the Vital Signs Indicators Project.
 - ▼ The Commission is committed to engaging more actively with the four treaty tribes.
 - Oil and Coal Trains
 - There is concern among Gorge residents regarding oil and coal shipments in the Gorge and expansions of railroad lines. The Commission is participating in that discussion.
 - Commissioners are called on to devote more time and energy to agency business.

Expenditure History + 2017-19 Governor's Budget





Agency Budget by Expenditure Category


