When antibiotics are overused, animals and humans alike, are at risk for developing bacterial strains that build up resistance to antibiotics (when you might actually NEED them!). I can't understand why anyone would want to put anything extra, especially unnecessary medicine, in their food or body.

I implore you to please support SB 785, which does not allow the routine use of antibiotics on farm animals for disease prevention.
