Todos Juntos Executive Summary

What is Todos Juntos?

Todos Juntos, established 2000, is a school and community based youth-development program reaching across cultural, gender and age boundaries to mitigate risk and improve protective factors among Priority Youth and families, and inclusively, the general school population. Students and families are connected with community- and school-based resources to affect positive changes leading to academic success.

Quick Stats on Todos Juntos:

Areas Served: Programs in 4 PreventNet and one KPI sites in four rural school districts in Clackamas County.

Number of students served: Each year, Todos Juntos has a positive effect on every student enrolled in the schools hosting PreventNet sites (1,966 students enrolled in 2016-2017). Over the last financing cycle (2015-2017) Todos Juntos has identified and helped 464 Priority Youth (at-risk students) providing them with and connecting them to resources and activities to improve grades, behavior and attendance.

Success Rate with Priority Youth (at-risk students): Average of 82% success over the last 2 years.

Objectives: Build protective factors in the child and family environment. Reduce risk factors. Increase family and community involvement in supporting schools and school-based programs. Strengthen collaboration among private nonprofit agencies, state and local governments, and schools

Methodology: Todos Juntos employees are placed in schools and work alongside school administrators and teachers to identify priority youth, provide during- and after-school programming, family resources and connection to community resources. The mission is inclusive to the entire school population, developing lasting partnerships with local resources and services benefitting all youth and families.

Services offered: Priority Youth (at-risk students) receive extra training in pro social skills, academics, and team building. They are connected to community resources, and referred to accredited programming (classes and activities) designed to promote success.

Steering: Quarterly meetings at each site with a broad range of community resources creates a web of support among schools, non-profit agencies, community members, local businesses and local government.

Number of full-time employees: 8 Number of part-time employees: 30

Classes Taught: Over 68 classes/programs in four separate communities. (See center foldout for each sites' programming)

Amount of Funding: The State of Oregon provided \$215K to Todos Juntos for the 2015-2016 school year.

Effectiveness of Funding: Because Todos Junto leverages community resources we have been able to provide programming and services more efficiently than using a purely paid staff approach. (See pull-quote on front cover.) We believe this approach is nearly twice as-cost effective as other approaches.

> * Cost-per-student figures are based on a combined one-year enrollment in Molalla River, Cedar Ridge, Baker Prairie Middle, Estacada Jr. High, and Sandy Grade of 1966 students, and funding Todos Juntos received from the State of Oregon in the 2016-2016 biennium of \$215,000.

At A Glance: Todos Juntos handles interventions for Priority Youth and after-school programming for all students in five schools for a state-funded cost of \$55 per student per year, or 33¢ per student per day.*

Need for Funding: Because funding from the State of Oregon is 'magnified' by leveraging community connections, increases in funding are multiplied by greatly increased services. Unfortunately, the multiplier effect is a two-edged sword: Reductions also result in sharply curtailed services. Reduced services cannot be cost-effectively replaced by other means.
