I would like to submit my support of the proposed changes relating to brewery-public house licensees; amending ORS 471.200.

As the rule currently exists, we are required to pay for additional off premise licensing every year for our second pub location. Although we do not have any production on site at this location, we are also required to complete monthly privilege reporting. As a small production brewery, we would appreciate the streamlining of the reporting process. We would also appreciate not having to pay duplicate licensing fees.

Per Steven Crowley from the OLCC, the ideal situation would be if we could just issue an Off-Premises Sales license (O) to our additional pubs instead of a BP license. He mentioned that since this is set up in statute, OLCC doesn't have the power to change it. He also stated that if a legislator wanted to introduce this change, it would just be a matter of adding one more exception into the Brewery-Public House statute as follows:

ORS 471.200(6) Notwithstanding subsection (3) of this section, a brewery-public house licensee is eligible for limited on-premises sales licenses, **off-premises sales licenses** and temporary sales licenses.

Attached is the email correspondence I had with the OLCC hoping to resolve the issues.
