WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Modifies and expands intrastate mutual assistance compacts used by local governments to include state and tribal governments. Renames them "Oregon Resource Coordination Assistance Agreements." Requires state government participation; permits tribal governments to opt in and local governments to opt out via resolution or ordinance. Directs the Office of Emergency Management (OEM) to develop procedures and guidelines for implementation.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Eliminating uncertainty of ad hoc arrangements during crises
- Conforming with guidance from National Emergency Management Association

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Oregon law currently provides for the state's participation in an interstate compact for emergency management assistance as well as local governments' use of intrastate mutual assistance agreements to enable flexible and responsive sharing of resources in the event of disaster.

Senate Bill 62 expands the use of intrastate mutual assistance compacts to include state and tribal governments along with local governments, and renames such agreements "Oregon Resource Coordination Assistance Agreements." The measure requires state government to participant while allowing local and tribal governments discretion to opt-out and opt-in, respectively.
