

## SB 118 Protect Local Education Dollars?

\$322 million per biennium of k-12 funding is lost in local property tax decision making. That's enough for more than 13 days of school.<sup>1</sup>

Oregon's school funding formula means a local decision in one community effects k-12 funding throughout the state. And the cost is significant.

In 2017-19 abatements and re-direction of funds will cost k-12 \$322 million:

Property Tax Abatements -- \$245 million<sup>2</sup>

Urban Renewal Districts -- \$77 million<sup>3</sup>

## Solution:

Protect k-12 funding from future local abatements and diversions as do a number of states, including Maryland, Florida, Texas, and even Alabama.

Examples:

- Florida with voter approval, cities can abate or divert their own property taxes and counties can abate or divert their own property taxes.
- Alabama All of the state and local portion of the property tax not earmarked for education on the real and personal property incorporated into a qualifying capitalized reinvestment project can be abated.
