We call for transparency in toxic emissions data that will allow the community to be informed about what is in the air, the water and the soil that people ingest.

Cully residents are physically burdened by the many highways, and I-205, which transverse our neighborhood. Cully is the most ethnically diverse neighborhood in Portland, therefore is also the most diverse neighborhood in Oregon. We unjustly shoulder a high proportion of the toxic-emissions burden in Northeast Portland, and act as the geographic toxic barrier for other, wealthier neighborhoods like Alameda and Roseway.

We cannot start to protect ourselves and our children under the current toxics legislation. The passage of House Bill 2669 will be the entry to giving us the opportunity to live healthier lives, and educate others about the hazards of industry in the area, in turn helping them to protect themselves and their children.
