6. Florence to North Bend

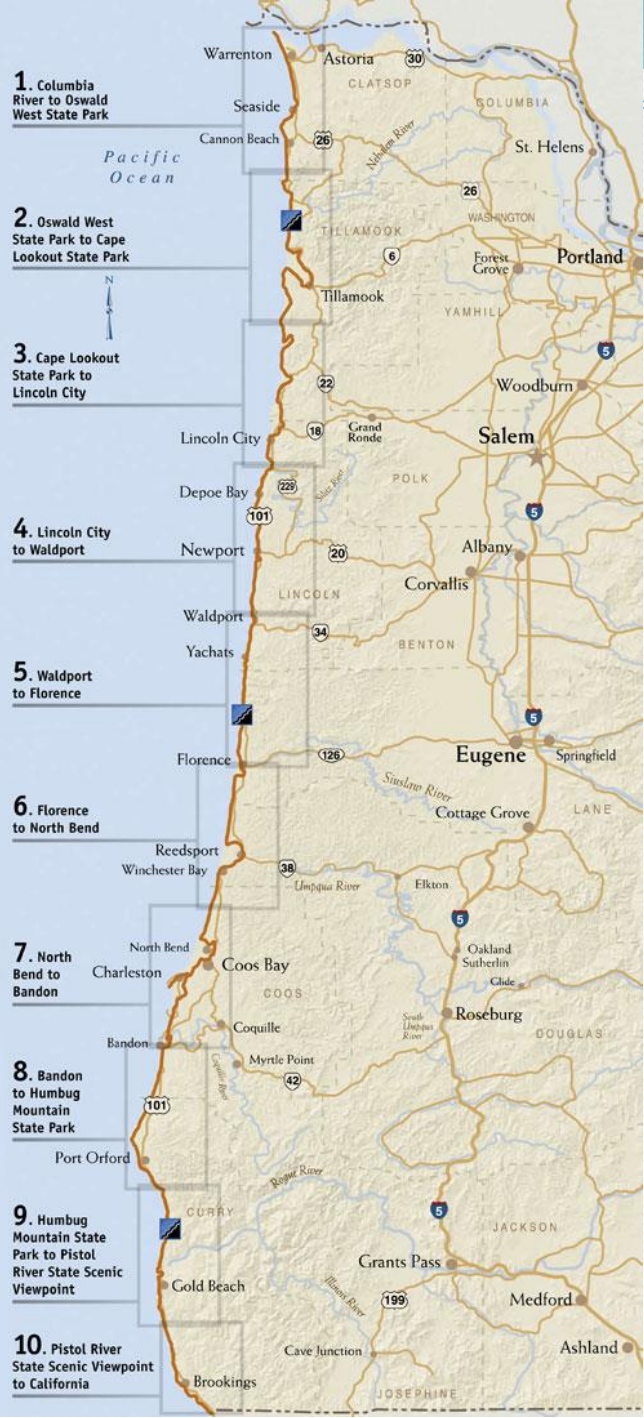
7. North Bend to Bandon

9. Humbug Mountain State Park to Pistol River State Scenic Viewpoint

10. Pistol River State Scenic Viewpoint to California

- 372 mile trail from Columbia River to California border
- OCT established over 40 years ago—still a work in progress
- Managed by Oregon State Parks and Recreation
- Most of trail on beaches and through state parks
- Gaps primarily outside OPRD jurisdiction



Half the trail is on the beach





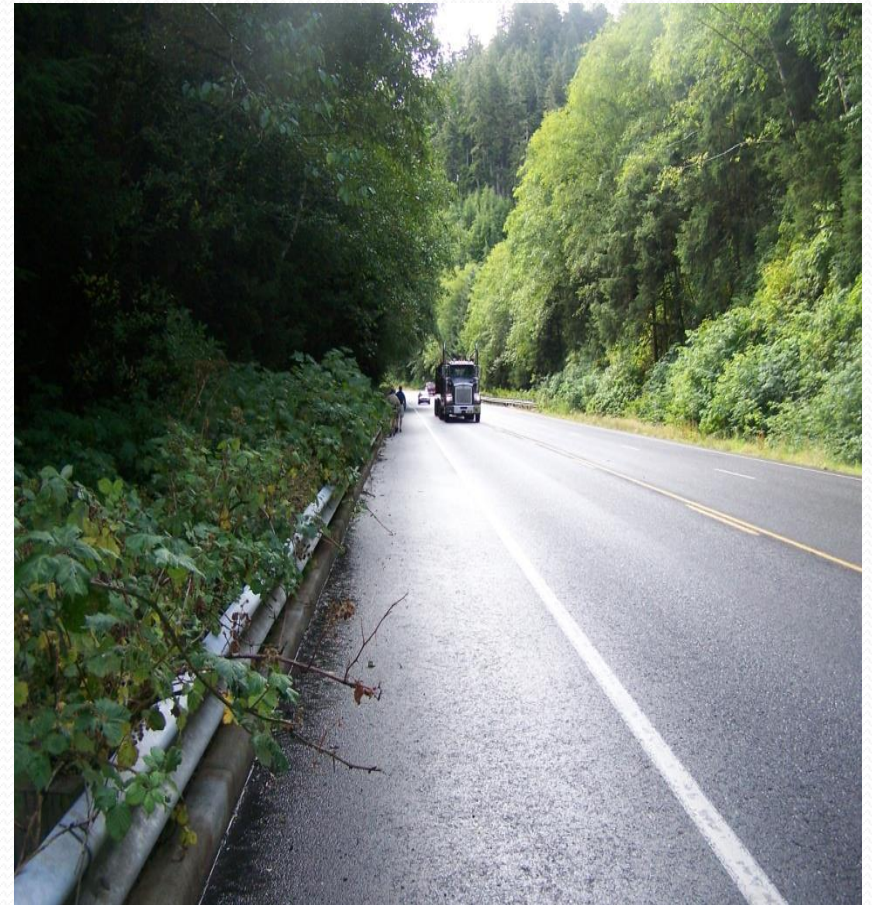


# A walk through history

- Crosses bridges designed by Conde McCullough in the 1930s
- Traverses historic 804 Trail in Yachats
- Visits places of significance to coastal tribes
