Chair Greenlick and members of the House Health Care Committee,

Please support HB 3135.

HB 3135 requires medical assistance coverage of long-acting, reversible contraceptive devices during a hospital stay for labor and delivery. This makes sense since it's preferable to address contraception during the inpatient stay.

HB 2527 defines "self-administered hormonal contraceptive" as it relates to Oregon's 2015 <u>landmark law</u>, which made birth control available through an Oregon pharmacist without a prescription.

Amendments to HB 2527 expand a pharmacist's ability to prescribe and administer injectable hormonal contraceptives as well.

Expanding access to injectable contraceptives is a good idea. However, I recommend HB 2527 be amended to require pharmacists advise these women of CDC <u>cervical cancer screening guidelines</u> when prescribing and administering contraceptives (both self-administered and injectable). It is important that a woman receives comprehensive reproductive health care, whether it is through her family practitioner or a Planned Parenthood facility.

I point out the following in this Lund Report guest column: House Bill 3391 is about Church v State:

Sadly, <u>abortion rates are higher among women of color</u>. The underlying reason for these disparities is financial access to health care. It's why there's a higher prevalence of sexually transmitted diseases, cervical cancer and diabetes among these women too. When <u>free contraceptives are available, abortion</u> rates plummet.

The House Health Care Committee should expand access to <u>free</u> contraceptives and comprehensive reproductive health care. Passing these two bills <u>in conjunction with the passage of HB 3391</u> would decrease unplanned births.
