## Good afternoon!

Monday morning in House Economic Development and Trade you will be hearing about HB 2155 which creates a new allocation under the Low Income Community Jobs Initiative which is the matching tax credit to the Federal New Markets Tax Credit. I wanted to make sure you had the following link to the Business Oregon's transparency website that lists the projects that benefited from investments under the first allocation of \$200 million under the program. It will tell you which companies were supported benefitted from the investments, how much was invested, how much federal investments were attracted to Oregon, how many jobs were projected to be added or retained, the average salary of the jobs created and whether the jobs have health insurance attached to them. The information is located at the bottom of the page and you can scroll through the information that continues off to the right hand side of the page. You will have to advance a few pages to see all of the projects.
