Dear Chair Helm:

Renewable Northwest is a regional, non-profit renewable energy advocacy organization based in Oregon. We are pleased to support HB 2020, a bill to support the Oregon Department of Energy and refocus its mission to better support the state in meeting both its energy policy and greenhouse gas reduction goals.

Our members are a combination of renewable energy businesses and environmental and consumer groups. We advocate for the expansion of environmentally responsible renewable energy resources in the Northwest through collaborations with government, industry, utilities, customers, and advocacy groups. Our organization shares a positive and productive relationship with the Oregon Department of Energy (the Department) with the goal of ensuring that the benefits renewable resources bring to Oregon are fully realized. Renewable Northwest, together with energy stakeholders across the state, collaborates with the Department in both the policy and regulatory arenas.

The Department fills a crucial role in the study, design, and implementation of renewable energy policies in Oregon, and is uniquely qualified and positioned to help the state achieve its energy policy goals. Given the strong correlation between climate and energy, we support HB 2020's aim to better link energy generation and consumption with the state's greenhouse gas reduction goals. This connection, and the Department's reorganization into the Oregon Department of Energy and Climate, will allow for high quality analysis and technical expertise on the two related subjects that can be applied to policy development, implementation of rulemaking, and compliance tracking.

As we face a changing energy future, with the state moving away from coal-fired resources and toward a 50% renewable energy standard, and as the state considers its role in addressing climate change head on, it will be critical to have an agency focused on the both climate and energy, as well as their undeniable link.

We are supportive of the formation of the Oregon Energy and Climate Board as an oversight and advisory body for the Department. While encouraging the Board to remain small in size, we do suggest changes to the board make-up, including:

- Creating two positions for "member[s] from an institution of higher education in Oregon with expertise in energy and climate issues" – one expert on climate issues, one on energy issues;
- Better clarification regarding the "member with expertise in transportation issues," perhaps as transportation issues relate to energy and/or climate;
