We greatly appreciate your attention and consideration for all of the testimony in support of OHCS and its programs, and for weighing the difficult choices you have to make given the budget realities facing the State. Recognizing the severe shortfall you are facing, we at Oregon ON along with many partners are also working hard to support multiple bills that will generate new revenue to support housing programs.

As community partners in delivering affordable housing and services to many vulnerable Oregonians, our members know firsthand the importance of resources to build and preserve affordable housing, as well as ensuring sufficient staff capacity at OHCS to get funding out of the door as quickly and responsibly as possible.

We would also like to voice our support of our new OHCS Director, Margaret Salazar. With the support of her leadership team and staff, she has already started the process of tackling some of the most longstanding issues identified in the most recent audit of the department. We ask that you support Director Salazar with the resources she needs to keep the department moving forward.

In closing, OHCS is a vital part of what makes affordable housing work in Oregon. Safe and stable housing is a basic need for every Oregonian regardless of race, socioeconomic status, or lived experience. We ask that you approve a budget that provides the foundation for selfsufficiency and upward mobility – a safe place to call home.
