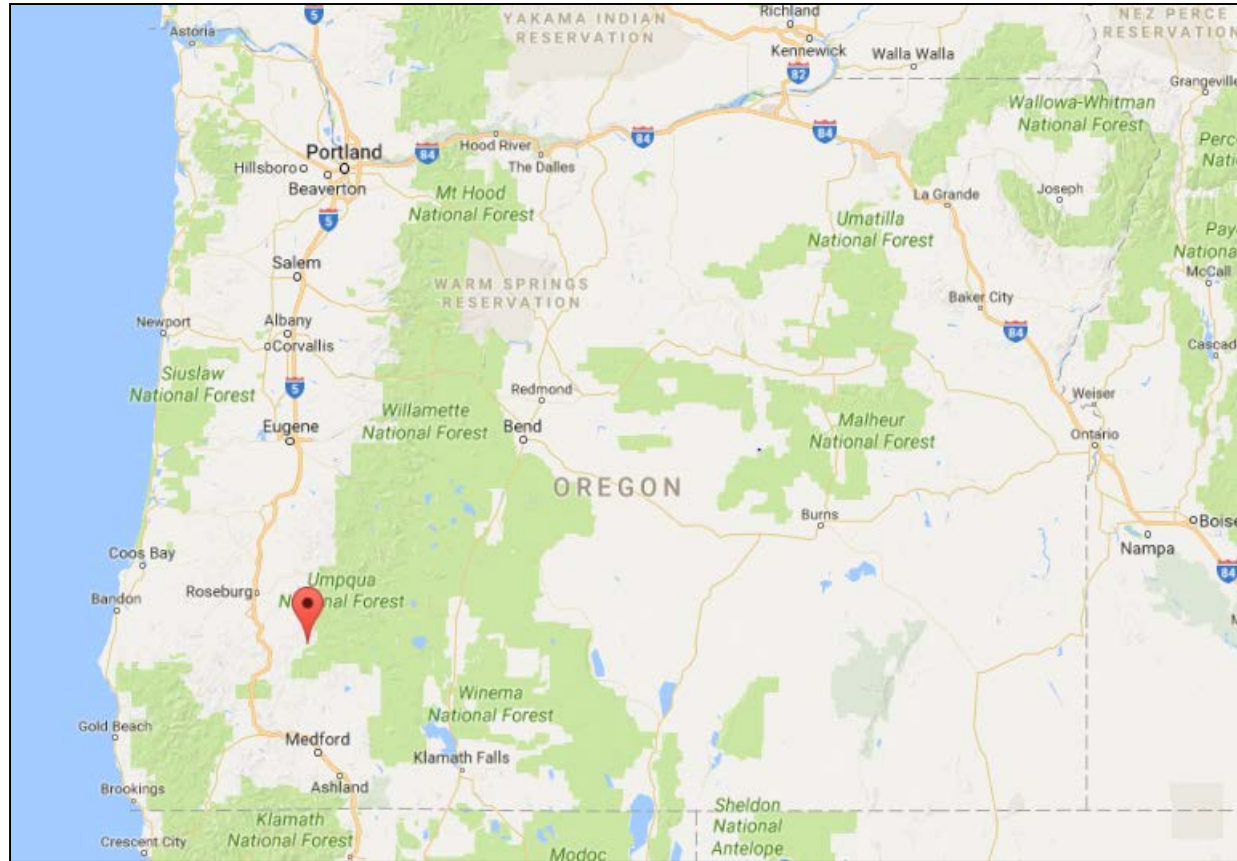
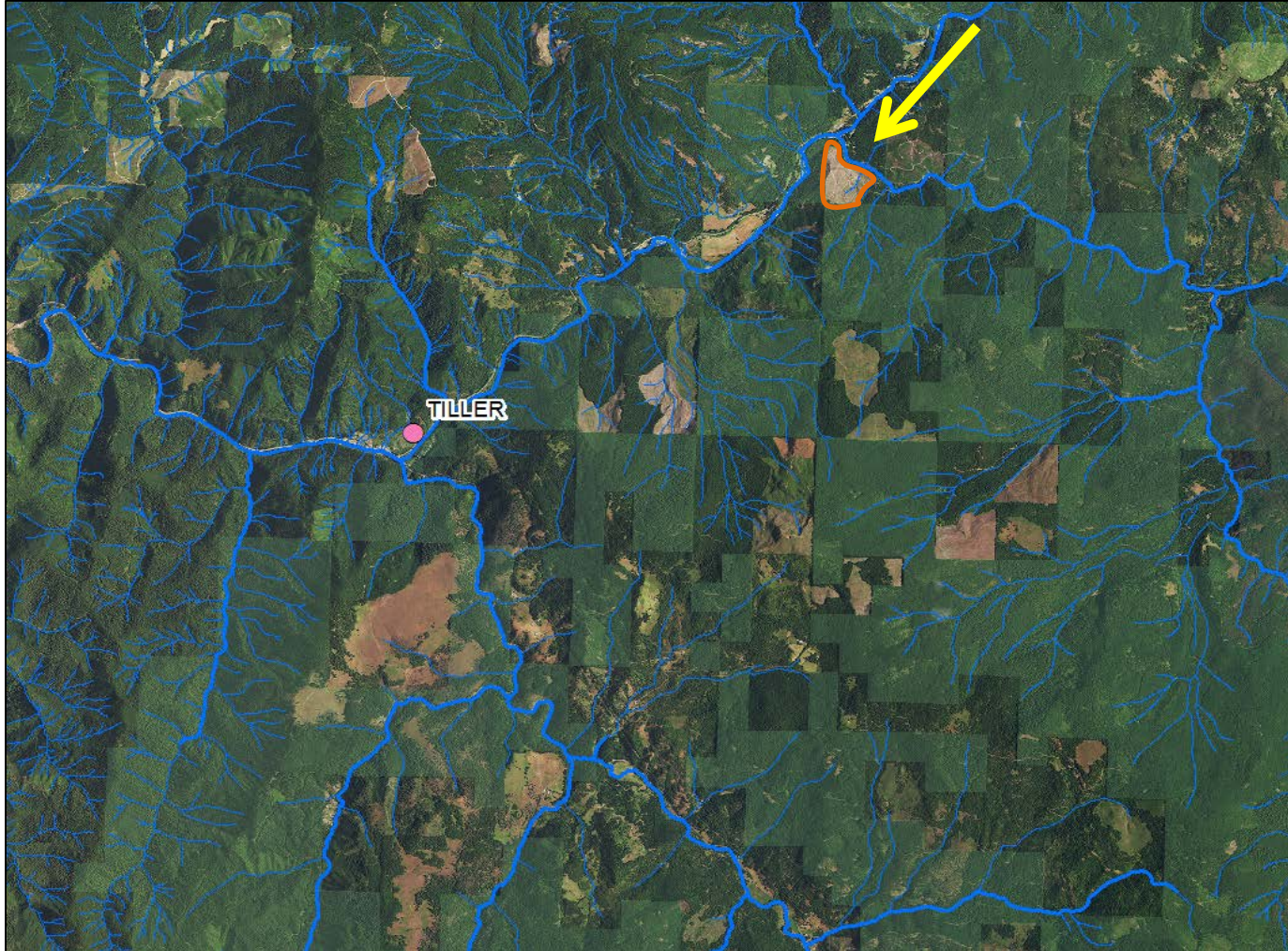


Drift From Forestry Aerial Spray Affected Local Residents in Tiller, Oregon (Douglas County)
