

Oregon Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force

Testimony in support of SB 884 Senate Committee on Judiciary Submitted by: Michele Roland-Schwartz, Executive Director

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Chair Prozanski, Vice Chair Thatcher, and members of the Senate Committee on Judiciary:

On behalf of the Oregon Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force¹, I submit this testimony in support of SB 884, which would require the Oregon Department of Justice to conduct a study on enacting a Sexual Assault Survivor's Bill of Rights.

Oregon is second in the nation (behind Alaska) in rates of sexual violence against women where 1 in 4 women will experience sexual violence in their lifetime, compared to 1 in 5 women nationally,² and where more than 1 in 3 Native women will be raped in their lifetime³. Ensuring that victims have access to full protection under the law, and unconditional access to justice is paramount in our efforts to remedy and mitigate the trauma experienced following an incident of sexual assault.

SB 884 follows passage of the Survivors Bill of Rights (2016), bipartisan legislation that provides a template for states to adopt similar legislation, and follows efforts, both nationally and locally, to improve the system response to victims of sexual violence. The ultimate goal is to lessen the burden experienced by victims when they make a report and access critical services such as a medical-forensic exam.

The spirit of the bill aligns with the mission of SATF, which is to advance a collaborative, survivor-centered, trauma-informed approach to the prevention of and response to sexual violence in Oregon. For this reason, we encourage your support of SB 884.
