SB 892, also known as the Timber Aerial Spray Right to Know bill, would allow rural residents to know before nearby aerial herbicide sprays commence. SB 892 would shorten the notification window for aerial helicopter sprays from 12 months to a few days in advance. Residents could also receive an e-notification from the ODF's FERNS system if the spray date is changed or canceled.

SB 500 seeks to lengthen Oregon's unusually short 60-day statute of limitations to report to damage from pesticides to the Department of Agriculture.

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SB 500 seeks to lengthen Oregon's unusually short 60-day statute of limitations to report to damage from pesticides to the Department of Agriculture.
