Expenditure History + 2017-19 Governor's Budget





- Liquor, beer, wine and associated revenues support agency operations and provide distributions to:
 - Oregon Wine Board
 - Mental Health, Alcoholism and Drug Services Account
 - General Fund
 - Cities
 - Counties
- Marijuana revenues support the marijuana program as well as the program's proportional share of agency-wide costs.

Key Investments

- Establishes one District Manager and one Business Analyst to support retail expansion efforts.
- Continues one Compliance Specialist 3 as Limited Duration, to assist in the appeal process during the initial marijuana licensing phase.
- Establishes one New Regulatory Specialist to support enforcement needs in the Southern Oregon region.

Revenue Adjustments

- As a result of retail expansion efforts, distilled spirits revenue is anticipated to increase by three percent
- Assumes the Commission will increase the surcharge on distilled spirits from \$0.50 to \$1.00 per bottle
- Increases alcohol related licensing fees, while maintaining the current fee for service permits

Statewide Adjustments

- Adjusts the DAS Price List and State Government Service Charges
- Adjusts Attorney General rates
