RE: **HB 2748 Amendments, Support**

Our association represents 60 retail stores, installers and chimney sweeps across Oregon who sell and install biomass heating appliances and natural gas heaters (wood and pellet stoves).

OHPBA is **in support of HB 2748** with the amendments offered by Oregon DEQ:

- Clarifying the definitions for "masonry heater" and "certified pellet stove."
- Clarify that the type of replacement devices will be determined by the Oregon DEQ. This provides some **flexibility** which was a point brought up in the hearing.
- Clarify that the grant funding program could also be used in areas that are currently not in violation, but have **risk** of exceeding the standard, based on recommendations from DEQ.

OHPBA believes Oregonians should have the right to heat their homes in a responsible way using the fuel source that is available to them and that fits their budget. In many rural Oregon towns, that source is cord wood, pellets and bio-bricks. These fuels must be used responsibly in EPA certified appliances using dry, seasoned wood and certified pellets. But many Oregonians in low income and rural areas cannot afford new biomass heaters, so they need financial assistance and the communities in which they live need financial support to help them move toward cleaner burning options. HB 2748 will provide that support.

Also, we advocate that only highly qualified installers should install wood stoves as represented by technicians certified by the **National Fireplace Institute**, the **Chimney Safety Institute of America** and the **Oregon Chimney Sweeps Association**.
