**Measure Description:**

Requires Oregon Business Development Department to establish voluntary registry for commercial interior designers.

**Government Unit(s) Affected:**

Cities, Counties, Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS)

**Analysis:**

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Economic Development and Trade to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means. The bill establishes a commercial interior designer certification program within Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS). DCBS is directed to establish rules regarding qualifications for certification and to assess fees for processing designer certifications. Municipalities would be prohibited from refusing to accept or impose additional conditions for plans, drawings, designs and specifications prepared by an interior designer certified under the new program. There is a fiscal impact and new fee revenue associated with this bill, the amount of this impact is still being determined. A more complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
