To call them "landfills" is to vastly understate their visual impact as well as the effects on air, water, soil and topography. What may have once been small scale low tech local dump sites have been acquired by Fortune 500 companies and expanded to a sizes unimagined by the original operators or jurisdictions. DOGAMI has special technical expertise in risk assessment of these manmade earthworks that dwarf the natural features around them.

Further, to grant such a significant exception to established standards by legislative fiat is dismissive of the many stakeholders who came together in the rule making process. It is unfair to other industries and public entities that are providing value to the state economy and citizenry while complying. The open and inclusive rule making process is conducted so all stakeholders and the public in general are on relatively even footing. The legislative process moves at a faster pace and in a setting that is not readily accessible to most citizens busy with their daily lives.
