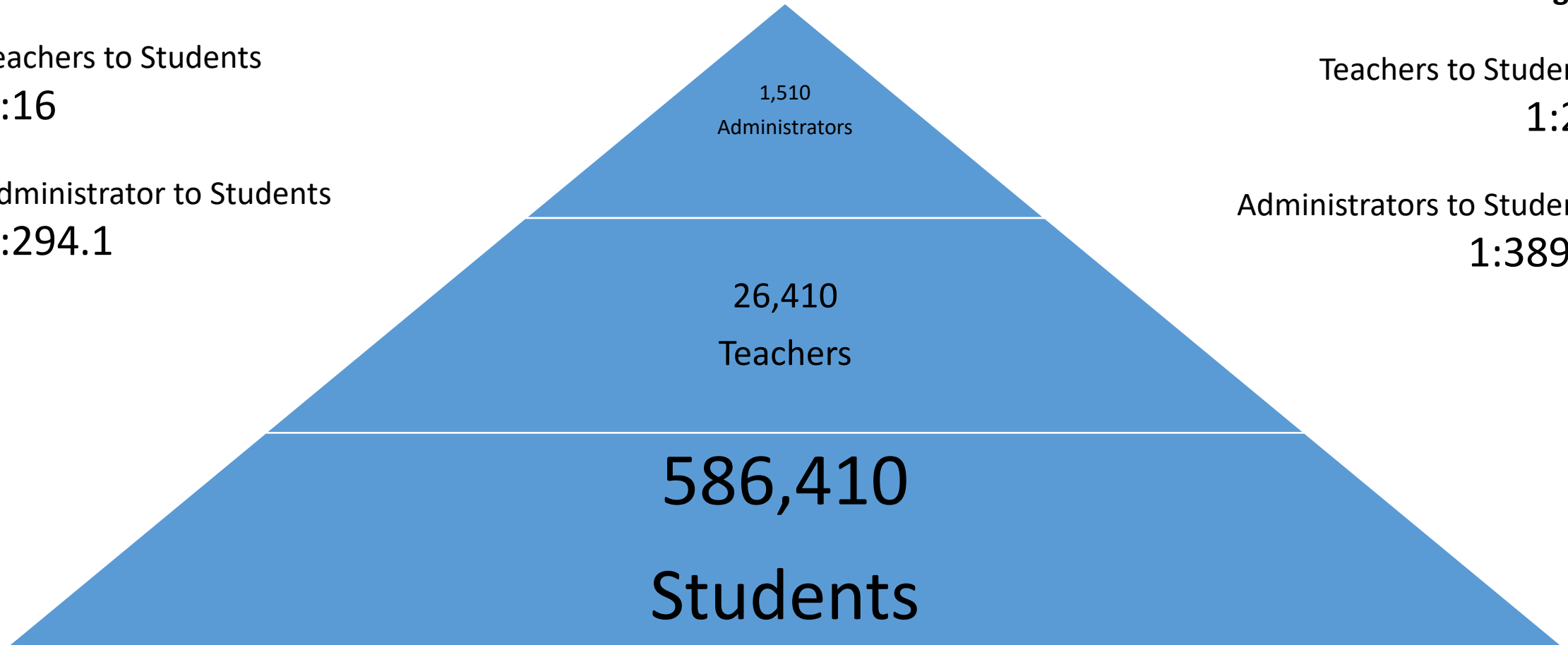

Figure 1: Total Number of Enrolled Education Bills, 2007-2016

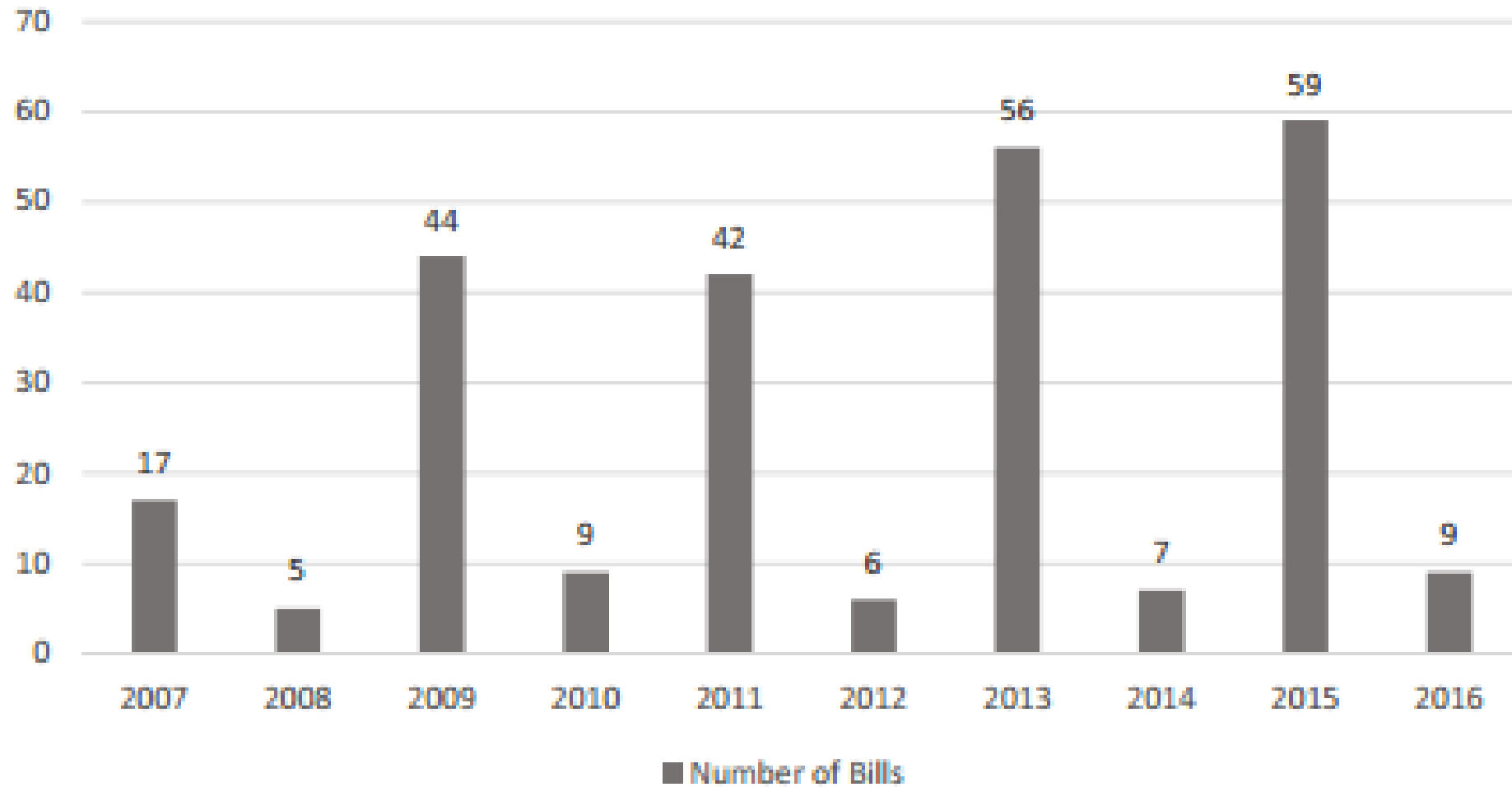
