I am Susan Jorg, a life-long citizen of the State of Oregon, 67 years of residence. I am a graduate of Oregon State University where I majored on Horticulture and Landscape Architecture. I worked at one of the largest plant nurseries in the state and I am now retired.

I support SB 687 which relates to the definition of child abuse. It provides that the definition of "child abuse" DOES NOT INCLUDE refusal to vaccinate a child or decision to delay vaccination of a child.

Thanks to a bill Richard Nixon pushed through in 1973, hospitals, clinics, and doctors are now "for profit" entities, when before they had been "community service" entities. Because of this change, going to a doctor can feel like walking through a shopping mall with various vendors hawking their products. The Affordable Care Act promises bonuses for doctors and hospitals that reach desired percentages of certain products sold. One of these products is vaccines, and nurses and doctors are getting very aggressive in their marketing of vaccines.
