BACKGROUND:

Brennan Gibson was born in Van Nuys, California, on December 27, 1979, the youngest of six children, and moved with his family to Springfield, Oregon, when he was six. He graduated from Thurston High School and went on to study art at Oregon State University, receiving his bachelor's degree in 2003 with an emphasis in graphic design. He met his wife at college and in 2004 they married. He enlisted in the United States Army the same month. He was assigned to C Company, 3rd Battalion, 509th Infantry (Airborne), 4th Brigade Combat Team of the 25th Infantry Division, based out of Fort Richardson in Alaska. On October 3, 2006, three days before Sergeant Gibson deployed, his son was born. Sergeant Gibson was killed on December 10, 2006, when an improvised explosive device detonated near the Humvee he was riding in while on late-night combat patrol in Baghdad, Iraq.

He was known for his kindness, his laugh, his sense of humor, and his interest in drawing and architecture. He was laid to rest at Willamette National Cemetery on what would have been his 27th birthday. Senate Concurrent Resolution 20 honors him.
