**SUBJECT:** SB 693, driver license suspensions and hardship permits

## **INTRODUCTION**

SB 693 will eliminate several driver license suspensions for non-driving related offenses, and will streamline the requirements for hardship permits to operate a vehicle while suspended. Forthcoming amendments will narrow the bill.

#### **BACKGROUND**

At any one time, Oregon has about 650,000 people with suspended driving privileges – with 2.6million active suspensions – on their record. Each year DMV processes roughly 360,000 suspensions on over 200,000 individual drivers.

Oregon law requires license suspension for many driving-related offenses such as DUII, or the Driver Improvement Program which requires administrative suspension if a person has too many moving violations in a short period of time. Oregon law also requires suspension for several offenses unrelated to driving. These include drug possession, theft of gasoline, littering. Finally, there are suspensions that span somewhere between a driving offense and something completely unrelated. These include such offenses as failure to appear in court or pay a traffic ticket. DMV has more than 400 separate codes for the various ways Oregon law requires suspension or revocation.

The laws granting limited driving privilege permits when suspended or revoked also are complex. The law provides for "hardship permits" for suspensions, and "probationary permits" for revocations. Various statutes allow a hardship permit for some offenses, such as DUII, vehicular assault, and reckless driving. But the statutes do not allow a hardship permit for other, arguably less serious offenses such as providing false information on the driver license application, or a conviction for possession of drugs. Permits allow the person to drive to work, substance abuse treatment, or for family medical needs. Some permits also allow use of the permit for "family necessities" such as grocery shopping, back and forth to school (for the person or their child), and caring for elderly family members. Specific proof is required to demonstrate each need, the permit must be limited to specific times of day, and DMV may impose other restrictions. The complexity of the hardship and probationary permit laws has necessitated DMV housing a handful of experts at headquarters; the permits are not issued in the field.

## **DISCUSSION**

SB 693 eliminates several suspensions that are not directly related to driving. These include drug convictions, school offenses, failing to pay taxes, providing false information to a police officer, theft of gasoline, and littering. While the base bill would eliminate several other suspensions, DMV understands a forthcoming amendment would restore those suspensions. The suspension for failure to install an ignition interlock device after a DUII conviction is one of those. Suspensions from the courts for failure to appear on a traffic-related offense, or failure to comply (e.g. pay the fine) on a traffic ticket conviction, would be restored in the amendment. Several suspensions involving juveniles also would be restored in the amendment.

The permit complexity also is addressed in the bill. Probationary permits are eliminated and replaced with hardship permits. Further, some allowances for hardship permits are eliminated or clarified. Under the bill hardship permits are not allowed for second or subsequent DUII convictions, or for any commercial driving privilege. Hardship permits all would require the same qualifications: application, SR-22 proof of insurance, a wait time before eligibility, and a fee, and for DUII cases an ignition interlock also would be required. The driving privileges allowed under a hardship permit would be standardized: for work, substance abuse treatment, and medical needs.

#### **SUMMARY**

The bill and amendment provide an opportunity to eliminate several suspensions that are not related to driving. The bill will also streamline the hardship permit requirements, making the law more consistent, easier for customers to understand and comply, and more efficient for the agency to manage.

# Oregon Suspension/Revocation/Cancellation Guide

If eligible for a hardship permit, "Yes" will be noted in the "HARDSHIP?" column along with the wait time a person must serve before DMV can issue a permit. Wait times begin on the suspension effective date or incarceration release date.

- Suspension lengths are increased if any of the following occurred in Oregon or any other jurisdiction within 5 years prior to current arrest: DUII conviction; participation in a diversion or similar alcohol or drug program; or a suspension of driving privileges under the Implied Consent Law. (ORS 813.430)
- A suspension for refusing to take a urine test shall be consecutive to any other suspension imposed under the Motorist Implied Consent law and the wait time for a hardship permit shall double. (ORS 813.132)
- A court may impose a fine of \$650 if the person refuses to submit to a breath or urine test. This is separate from any other court fine resulting from the DUII arrest. (ORS 813.095)

A person may be suspended for the same offense under the IC laws and the DUII laws. IC actions are DMV administrative suspensions separate from any suspension or revocation imposed by a court on the DUII conviction for the same offense.

• Any wait time served on a DUII/IC suspension resulting from the same offense will be credited to the wait time for the corresponding DUII/IC suspension.

#### **MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION**

#### Incarceration

Other than Habitual Offender, any suspension or revocation "Length" noted with "not<" indicates the time length is established by the persons release from incarceration.

- If the sentencing did **not** include incarceration, the sanction time length is as noted above from the beginning date of the revocation or suspension.
- If the sentencing included incarceration, the sanction time length is as noted above from the date the person is released from incarceration for all crimes arising out of the same criminal episode.

#### Non-Resident / No Current Driving Privileges

A court may suspend or revoke the driving privileges of any nonresident for any cause for which the driving privileges of a resident of this state may be suspended or revoked. ORS 809.230

If a person is not currently licensed or the person's privileges expire within the suspension period, DMV or the Court shall suspend or revoke the person's right to apply for driving privileges to operate motor vehicles in this state. ORS 809.360

#### Out-of-Jurisdiction

DMV may suspend Oregon driving privileges and/or commercial driving privileges if the driver is suspended or revoked out-of-state or based on an out-of-state conviction. ORS 809.400, 809.510(6)
