On behalf of the American Lung Association in Oregon, I am writing to express our opposition to HB 2481. We believe that this proposal intends to undermine ongoing and successful implementation of a vital public health

protection law by presenting misleading and incomplete information to the

public.

HB 2481 would require gas station receipts to display information about the Clean Fuel Standard while ignoring the public health and environmental damages caused by petroleum products. The American Lung Association strongly supported the adoption and ongoing implementation of the Clean Fuels Standard to drive down the substantial public health harms caused by burning petroleum products by promoting cleaner fuel choices.

Our 2016 "Clean Air Future" report showed that the cost of pollution from the passenger vehicle fleet in Oregon amounts to over \$1 billion per year in terms of health and climate change impacts, or about \$18.42 per fill up.1 It is important to note that the estimated \$1.3 billion in annual health costs does not include the costs of environmental damages caused by carcinogenic toxic air contaminants2, damages from fuel spills, or the costs of petroleum dependence. The costs of fossil fuel pollution are borne by all Oregonians, but our children, seniors and other residents living with asthma, COPD, lung cancer and other respiratory and cardiac conditions face increased risks, as

do communities facing higher burdens and exposures to local traffic pollution sources.3

Oregonians should be educated about the clean air and public health benefits of the clean fuel standard; this bill seeks to undermine the rule by painting an incomplete, misleading picture of this health-protective measure.

Oregonians need factual and real information about the health impacts of our fuels choices. We urge you to vote no on HB 2481.
