I took a trip to Seattle two years ago on a vacation with a friend at the time. While we were there, we chose to use Uber most of the time. True, it cost an arm and a leg but we prepared ourselves for it because compared to a cab, their app told us when a ride was avalable, who the drivers were and all other information that we'd need. They were great drivers. They gave us great service and they also saved us a lot of time. Uber is a lot quicker than a cab. For example, when a cab isn't avalable for 2 or 3 hours, Uber might be avalible in just 6 minutes. Ride sharing services fill in a missing gap in public transportation in Oregon. In many cities in Oregon, public transportation isn't even offered at all. In cities like Salem, public transportation isn't available on weekends. For Salem resadents who don't drive or can't drive but want or need to travel around Salem on the weekends would greatly benefit from ride sharing services. The same is true for all Oregonians.
