Re: Support for SB 327

Dear Chair Prozanski & Members of the Senate Judiciary Committee,

The Metropolitan Mayors Consortium (MMC), representing the mayors of twenty-five cities in the Portland Metropolitan Area, strongly supports SB 327, which would restore meaningful recreational immunity to cities. Restoring recreational immunity is critical to ensuring that our residents continue to have access to public lands. Without recreational immunity, many cities will be forced to close down parks, trails and other public spaces because the potential legal liability will lead to dramatically higher insurance rates. This increase in insurance rates will necessitate cuts in other areas of our budgets.

SB 327 would restore the needed immunity, which had been codified by the courts for years before a recent decision by the Oregon Supreme Court upended years of precedent and exposed cities to extensive liability.

Restoring recreational immunity is one of the MMC's top legislative priorities for the 2017 Legislative Session. We strongly urge your support for SB 327.
