RE: DHS APD Presentation Follow-Up Questions.

Good day, here are the answers to the remaining questions as follow-up from Ways and Means:

- 1) Below is a chart showing total number of allegations in facilities and the numbers of substantiated allegations. The substantiations include abuse and non-abuse violations.

- 2) The most recent data with regard to our survey intervals is as follows:
 - a. NF survey interval as of today is 13.42 months with 9 facilities over 12.9 months.
 - b. Residential Care Facilities/Assisted Living survey interval as of today is 27.93 months with 72 facilities over 24 months.
- 3) Below is a summary of the work that was done by the Centralized Abuse Management team and OAAPI staff around what various State abuse reporting systems include:

The team talked with about 20 states – at the time we did the outreach, some were at a similar point in the process as we were – trying to gather comparison data between states so they could make decisions. Two states were in the RFP process and declined to discuss. We focused on states that were using a SACWIS system (stands for State Automated Child Welfare System and it's a federally approved case management system

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like OR-Kids) to see if any were viable for our needs. Most of those are huge monolithic systems and they found adult protective services generally took a backseat to the needs of child welfare when they needed changes or updates to their system.

We realized after speaking with several states that there is a new trend in looking at vulnerable people as a population as opposed to children/DD/APS.

We ended up doing a comparison between several states that are using a HARMONY product and several who were using something else.

For the HARMONY states here are our results regarding whether or not they are using the system for child abuse and adult abuse.
