BACKGROUND:

According to Metro the Southwest Corridor area is home to more than 10 percent of the Portland region's population, spanning from downtown Portland out to Tigard, Tualatin and Sherwood, Oregon. A part of the Southwest Corridor Plan is a proposed 12-mile MAX light rail line from downtown Portland to Tigard and Bridgeport Village in Tualatin. Light rail is typically paid for by a mixture of federal and local dollars.
