Members of the Oregon State Senate Judiciary Committee:

I came to Oregon in 1962 when I was 15 years old. Now, at age 70, I can tell you that I have vivid memories of a free state when one did not have to fear what the government was going to do to you next. That Bloomberg the gun banner could buy our officials, including this governor, and that we carry on as if nothing had happened, is surreal to me. Wayne Morse must be spinning in his grave.
