Honorable Chairman and Committee Members,

I am in support of the Real ID act but want to make sure that it is not sabotaged by allowing for some to get an alternate ID. We should NOT have a 2 tier ID system.

Oregonians voted overwhelmingly to stop Driver's cards. Oregonians obviously do not want them. For our ID to mean anything it needs to be straight forward with the same criteria for all.

As far as marking the 2 types of ID cards. When the Driver's card was suggested in the past legislative sessions, it was to be designed per Legislative direction, to be identifiable as a different card. Yet when records request on the design for that card was revealed from DMV, the only difference was that there was a lavender strip on the card instead of a blue strip. There was nothing written on the card to show it's a unique type of ID. Mosts people would not realize the difference thinking it might be a faded ID card. Leaving many of these rules stated in the law, to be made by the department by rule, takes it from the hands of the people through their legislators. It becomes an unaccountable system.

Other systems depend on the data stored at the DMV such as the <u>Justice department for our jury pool</u> and for the Elections Division with Automatic Voter Registration. We are not just designing a system for driving on our roads. This has far reaching consequences. You are establishing laws regarding ID to drive, get on a plane, compose our jury pool, and register people to vote.

I do not have confidence in a 2 tier system. All Oregonians should be subject to the same rules and those regulations which should be spelled out in the legislation for these critical functions that are clearly identifiable and accountable.
