Expenditure History + 2017-19 Governor's Budget



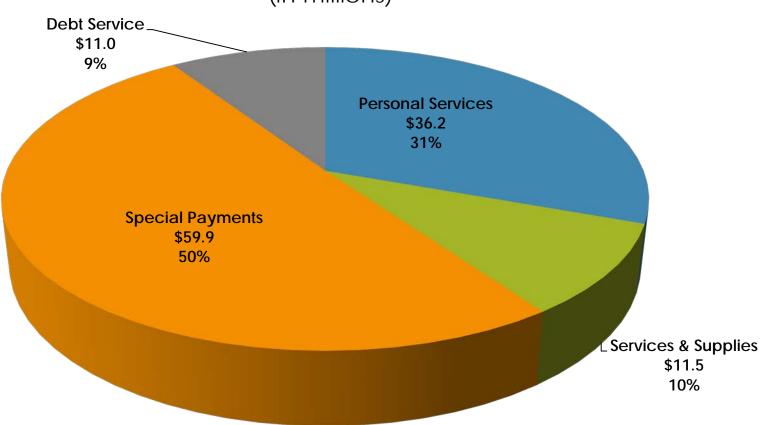

2017-19 Governor's Budget





Reductions

- Package 070 Revenue Shortfall due to rollback of water right transaction fee to 2009 levels – eliminates 2.50 FTE.
- Package 090 Analyst Reductions reduced feasibility study grants and Services and Supplies. Eliminated 4.67 FTE; one position was fund shifted to Lottery Funds.
- Statewide adjustments
 - Updates to the DAS Price List and State Government Services Charges

Fee Changes

- House Bill 2295 removes the sunset from the water right transaction fees and increases the current fee by 15.88 percent.
- House Bill 2296 impacts well construction bonding and permit fees.
