WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Prohibits person under age 18 from being incarcerated in a Department of Corrections institution.

REVENUE:No revenue impactFISCAL:May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Currently, when a person is under age 18 when he or she commits an offense and under age 20 at the time of commitment to the Department of Corrections (DOC) at sentencing, that person's physical custody must be transferred to the Oregon Youth Authority if the person will complete the sentence before turning age 25 or DOC and OYA determine that, because of the person's age, immaturity, mental or emotional condition or risk of physical harm to the person, the person should not be incarcerated in a DOC institution. A person placed at OYA under this provision is returned to the physical custody of DOC if the conditions or circumstances that warranted placement at OYA are no longer present. House Bill 2251 would add a requirement that a person's physical custody be transferred to OYA if the person is under age 18 at the time of sentencing and commitment. Persons transferred to the physical custody of DOC until the person is 18 years of age. HB 2251 also prohibits a person under age 18 from being incarcerated in a DOC institution under any circumstances. Makes minor and conforming changes.
