BACKGROUND:

Dolores Hewitt Atiyeh was born in Portland, Oregon on November 8, 1923 and passed away on August 29, 2016 at the age of 92. Dolores was educated in Portland public schools and was a scholarship honor student in art at the University of Oregon. Dolores married Victor Atiyeh in 1944 and the couple had two children, Tom and Suzanne. Dolores partnered with her husband Victor during his 20 years of service at the Legislative Assembly, and served honorably as Oregon's first lady from January 1979 to January 1987 while her husband served as Governor. Dolores Atiyeh was a champion of various art, charitable and historic causes, particularly those supporting children and young adults. Additionally, Mrs. Atiyeh was an avid volunteer who worked with several organizations including the Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts, Parent Teacher Association, Japanese Garden Society, Arts Coalition Northwest, Portland Art Museum and the Historic Preservation League of Oregon. Dolores Atiyeh was an advocate who successfully campaigned for legislation establishing mandatory immunization of children and seatbelts for children under the age of 5.

Senate Concurrent Resolution 15 expresses the Legislative Assembly's highest admiration and profound gratitude for Dolores Atiyeh's contributions to the State of Oregon, including her passion for youth, promotion of child safety legislation, her leadership and her love and support for her husband, children, and grandchildren.
