Measure Description:

Directs Oregon Business Development Department to study barriers to development of industrially zoned lands and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 1, 2018.

Analysis:

The bill directs the Oregon Business Development Department (OBDD) to study barriers to the development of industrial zoned lands, and report back to the Legislature no later than September 1, 2018.

OBDD anticipates implementing the bill by hiring a third-party contractor, at an estimated cost of \$150,000 Lottery Funds in the 2017-19 biennium, to work with stakeholders to define the parameters of the study, gather and analyze data from various sites, review existing laws, and prepare a report suitable for use in a Legislative presentation. The agency will utilize existing staffing resources to coordination with other state agencies (i.e. Oregon Department of Transportation, Department of Land Conservation and Development, Department of Environmental Quality, Department of Sate Lands) to incorporate their perspectives into this report.

The bill should be referred to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means for additional review of the scope of the study, and of its impact on the agency’s legislatively adopted budget.
