Measure Description:

Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to develop plan for enabling community colleges to offer associate's degree completed in coordination with credits earned in apprenticeship or training program.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Higher Education and Workforce Development to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means. The bill requires the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) to develop a plan for enabling community colleges to offer an associate's degree completed in coordination with credits earned in a registered apprenticeship or training program that is a minimum of four years in length. The bill specifies parameters that must be included in the plan. HECC must to submit report containing the plan and any proposed legislation to Legislative Assembly by December 1, 2018. The HECC anticipates requiring 1.5 FTE to perform the required activities under the bill. A more complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
