WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Decreases penalty for crime of cheating to Class A misdemeanor.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 Replaces measure. Requires defendant, upon conviction of commercial sexual solicitation, to notify court of all licenses, certificates, permits and registrations the person holds. Requires court to notify all of these entities. Defendant is subject to contempt of court for knowingly failing to provide this information. Requires these issuing entities to notify applicants that applicant must agree to comply with this provision. Revokes hunting and angling licenses or tags from State Department of Fish and Wildlife for one year. Creates and requires defendant to complete john school. Creates diversion program for this offense. Requires suspension for six months of driving privileges upon conviction unless court finds compelling circumstances.
