WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Establishes the ability of retail electricity consumer to purchase electricity generated by eligible renewable energy resources and certain ancillary services directly from an entity that is not a distribution utility, provided that the entity meets specified conditions. Changes requirements for entity that is not a distribution utility from which a retail electricity consumer directly may purchase electricity. Becomes operative January 1, 2018. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Many companies seeking to go to 100 percent renewable power
- Increasing amount of renewable power available
- Different methods for providing direct access to renewable power
- Method for access to renewable power prior to Senate Bill 1149 (2001)
- Balancing needs of small and large customers
