

SB 88 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Changes name of fee to use an electronic government portal from "convenience" fee to "portal provider" fee. Clarifies a quorum of the Electronic Government Portal Advisory Board is a majority of voting members. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

[-1 amendment] Removes emergency clause.

BACKGROUND:

An electronic government portal is the internet site where a state agency delivers information or products or services. Fees may be charged for the operation or use of such portals. Current statutes refer to such fees as "convenience" fees. The same term is used by the payment industry to describe fees that merchants, including state agencies, may assess customers that pay using credit or debit cards.

Senate Bill 88 changes "convenience" fee to "portal provider" fee throughout the statutory section referring to fees to use electronic government portals, in order to distinguish it from fees assessed in the payment industry. The measure also clarifies that a quorum of the Electronic Government Portal Advisory Board is a majority of its *voting* members, rather than a majority of members.
