

Oregon youth age 16 - 21 not in school with no HS completion or equivalent










Share of all Oregon youth age 16 - 21 not in school with no HS completion or equivalent

Oregon High School Dropout Rates




Dropout Rates by County

• The range is a high of 52.46% (Wheeler) to a low of .73% (Wallowa)

Dropout Rates by Region

- 1. 5.19% (Southern)
- 2. 4.58% (Central)
- 3. 3.66% (Willamette Valley)
- 4. 3.29% (North Eastern)
- 3.97% (North Coast)
- 6. 2.65% (South Eastern)



Dropout Rates by East/West

- East of the Cascades is 4.24%
- West of the Cascades it is 3.88%

Next Steps



1) Reengagement

School districts should be **directed and incentivized** to reengage out-of-school youth.

2) Funding

➤K-12 Funding must **follow reengaged students** (up to age 21) to high school completion programs best suited to their needs.

3) Accountability

Accountability systems must **remove disincentives** for re-enrolling out-of-school youth and recognize the success of programs serving youth beyond the 4-and 5-year graduation window.
