My name is Ruth Barrios I live in the Deschutes County.

Rural Deschutes **DID NOT** vote to legalize marijuana, nor did we vote to turn marijuana which is federally illegal into an agricultural crop, the legislature did.

I am here today to support Deschutes County Commissioners and oppose any attempts through the -11 amendment to try and remove any of the current marijuana regulatory time, manner, and place regulations. Deschutes County has spent months listening to all concerns of both the marijuana industry and rural residents.

Deschutes is a legacy to this State because of its pristine nature, its quiet nights, Clean air and water. It's what attracts tourism which helps our economy. If the marijuana industry wants fairness then they should be required to abide by all County, State, and Federal laws like all other rural farmers.
