Hello, my name is Matt Etheredge and I firmly stand against SB764, 868, 797. I have lived in Oregon most of my life and have always admired the people's free spirit. I think the saying, "live and let live" best describes the State and it's people. I am disheartened to see the bills coming out of Salem, especially directed toward legal firearm ownership. While other states governments are acknowledging the people's right to carry with "constitution carry", here in Oregon, law makers are blatantly ignoring our rights. I think to most, self defense is a human right that should never be limited. These bill are obviously doing that. Take SB764 for instance, this bill is misguided at best and an infringement of basic rights at worst. When my wife and I got our concealed carry permits it took weeks and a lot of money. For a domestic abuse victim, time is of essence. Yet if they want to legally carry they would have to wait weeks. Lets face it, they may not have weeks.
