

SB 41 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

House Committee On Higher Education and Workforce Development

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Clarifies that Oregon Employment Department (OED) may disclose information in OED records to public universities and Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) to extent necessary to carry out government planning, performance measurement, program, socioeconomic or policy analysis functions. Clarifies disclosed information is confidential and may not be disclosed by universities in manner that would identify individuals, claimants, employees or employing units. Authorizes OED to disclose to any person establishment level information secured from public universities and OHSU. Updates citation to federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. Updates administrative duties and authorities of OED Director concerning workforce and labor data analysis. Clarifies home care workers are not state employees for purposes of workforce and labor market information. Repeals Occupational Program Planning System. Deletes provisions related to discontinued Shared Information System.
