WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires a coordinated care organization's (CCO) community advisory council (CAC) to develop and adopt a community health improvement plan that includes a strategy to integrate a set of comprehensive health services.

BACKGROUND:

House Bill 3650 (2011) and Senate Bill 1580 (2012) enabled the creation of coordinated care organizations (CCOs) in Oregon. Oregon law requires each CCO to have at least one community advisory council (CAC). A CAC must include representatives from the community and county government, with consumers making up the majority of the CAC. Each CAC is required to oversee a community health assessment, adopt a community health improvement plan (CHIP) and annually publish a report on the CCO's progress on the CHIP. Each CAC's CHIP should describe the scope of activities, services and responsibility that the CCO will consider.

The initial community health improvement plans created by CACs often did not include plans to integrate physical, behavioral and oral health services. Subsequent plans and reports required by CACs have not addressed the need for plans and strategies to integrate services for enrollees served by CCOs. House Bill 2675 requires a CAC's community health improvement plan to focus on and develop strategies for the CCO to integrate physical, behavioral and oral health services.
