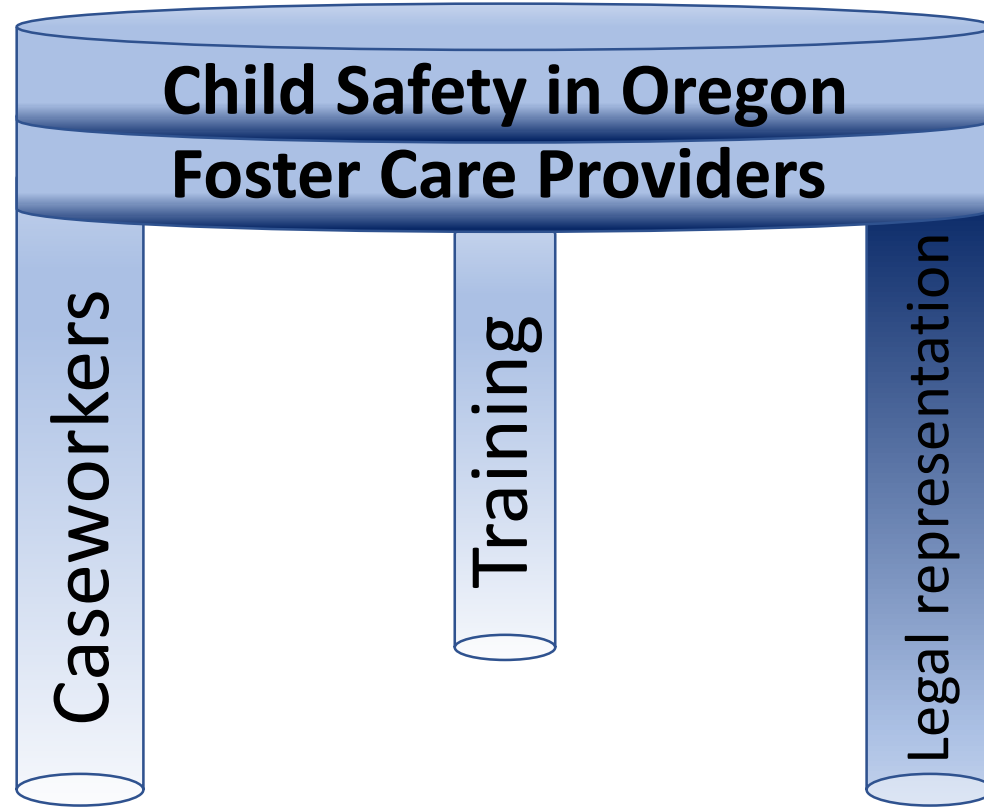


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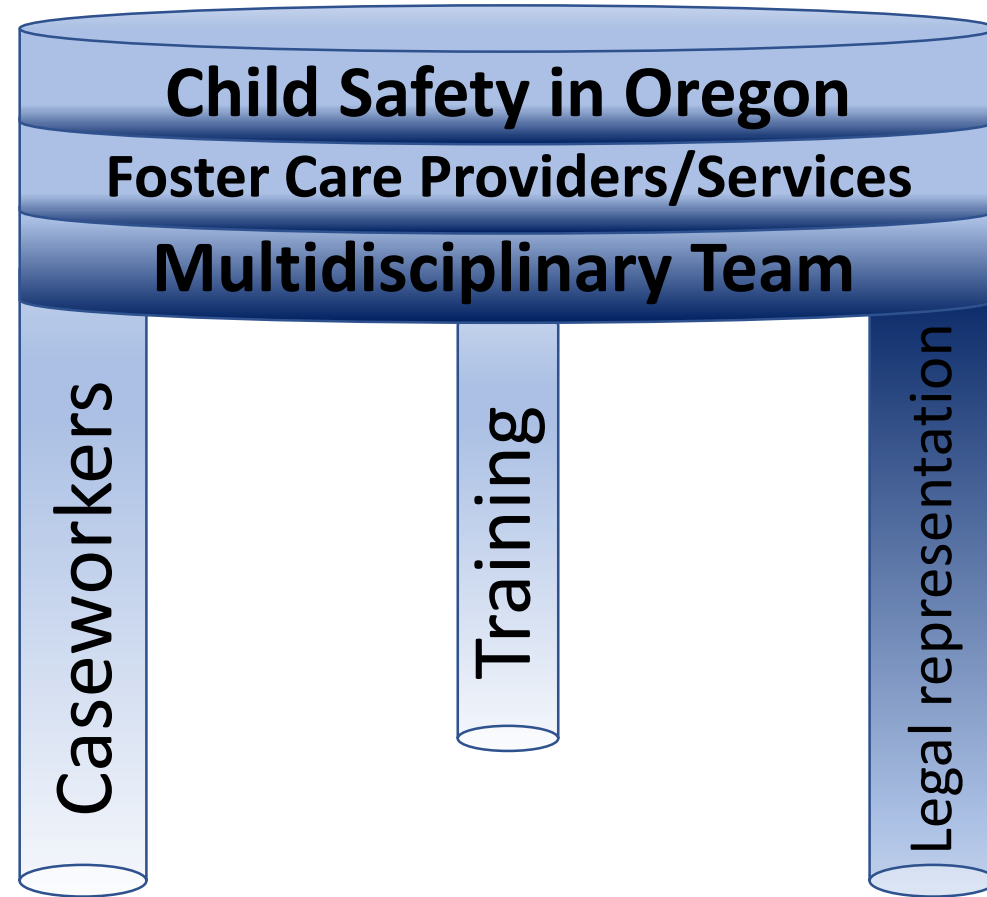


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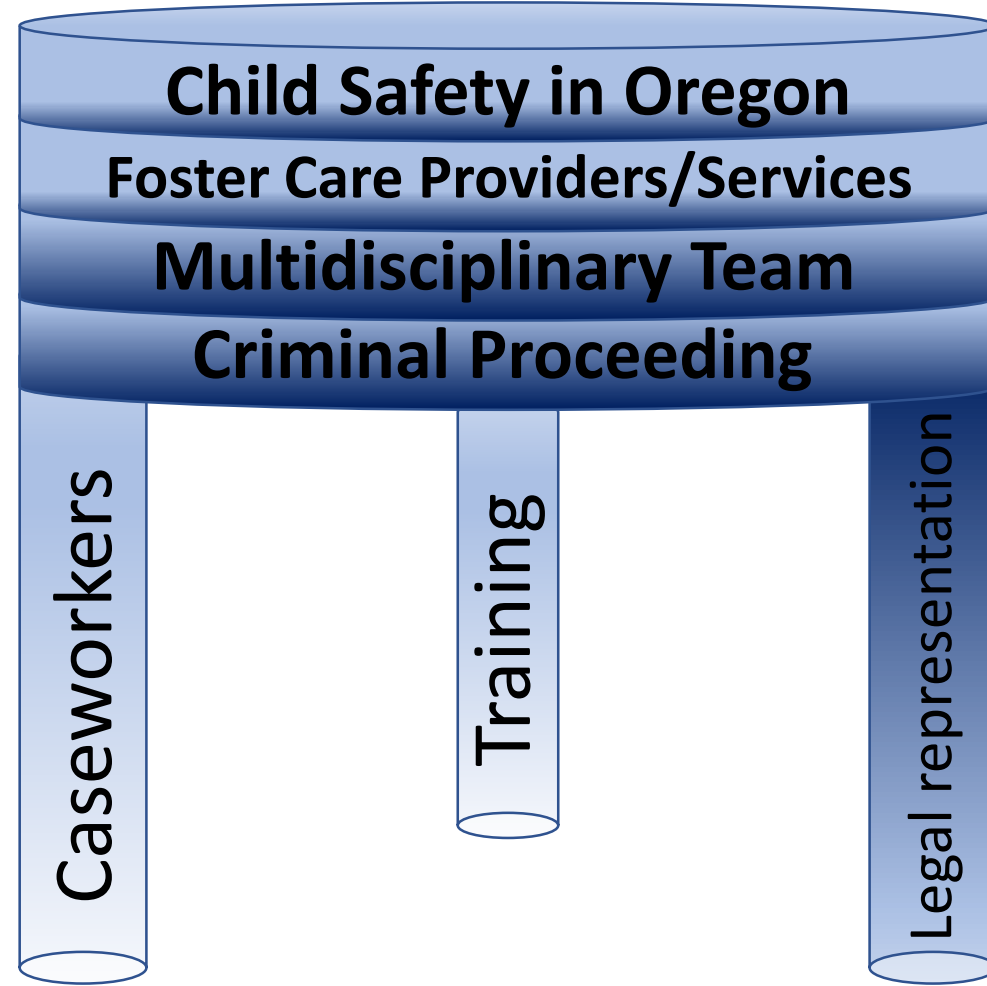


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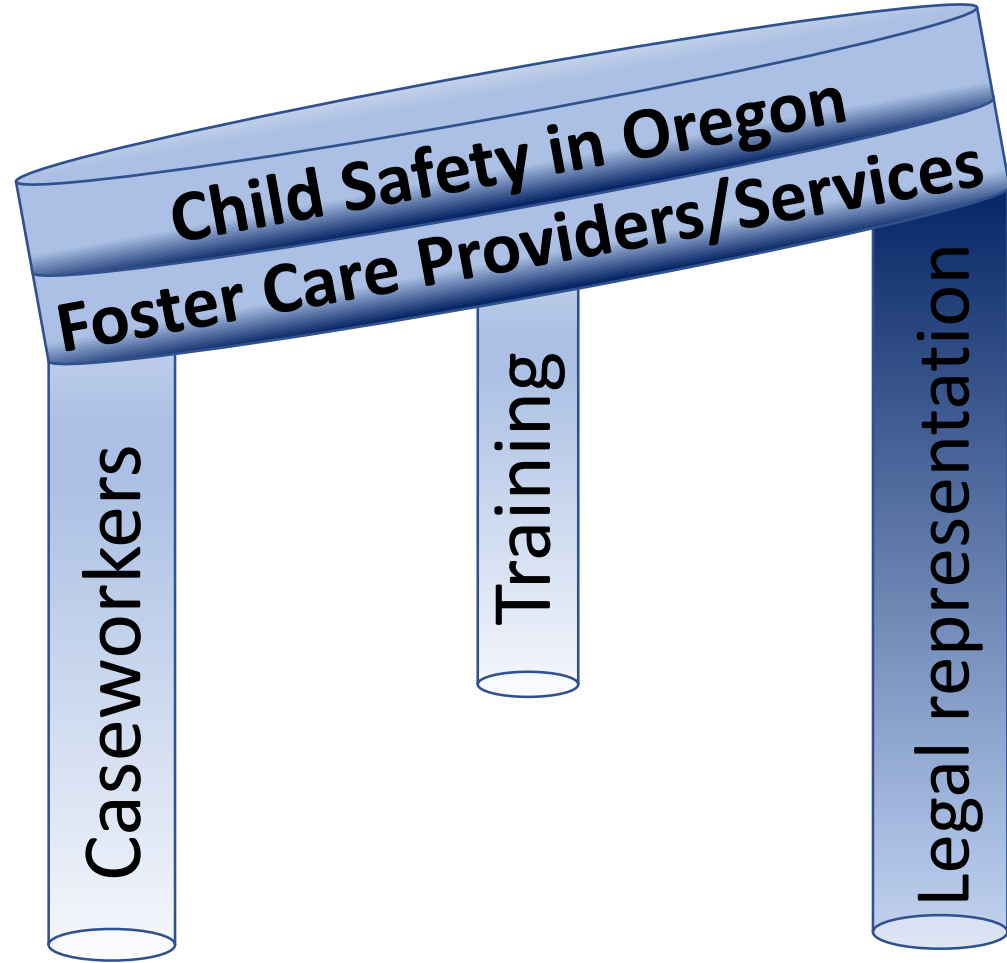


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Options for no-cost improvement:

- Augment training for current and new case workers;
- Better coordination of services between district attorneys that are engaged in dependency work;
- Cross-county training for deputy DAs;
- Stronger contractual requirements;
- Replication of best practices.

Lower cost improvements:

- Statewide DA dependency coordinator;
- Augmented training budget for DAs or DOJ;
- Augmented resources for DAs and DOJ;
- Facilitation of IV-E grant documentation.
