






STP 2015-2017 Stage Gate Deliverables




STP Budget

Budget breakdown







ODOT REAL ID Report

- Four options
- Option #2 Customer Choice
- Legacy systems or STP
- Three years (Summer 2020)





Multiple ID options Empowering Oregonians





- Standard card (not compliant)
- Not for federal ID purposes

- Use as ID to enter federal buildings
- Valid for TSA security
- Requires additional fee and documents



Senate Bill 374-A

Removes legal barriers to compliance

Compliance actions; fees

Operative date – July 1, 2020

Enforcement extension likely from DHS



Oregon compliance gaps

Areas to address

Electronic verification including:

- Birth certificates
- U.S. passports
- DL/ID issued by other states
- Lawful status
- Re-verify SSN and immigration status at renewal




Oregon compliance gaps (cont.)

Areas to address

- Retain copies of application, declaration and identity source documents
- Card design includes approved security markings
- Conduct name-based and fingerprint-based criminal history checks on employees
- Submit Final Certification package to Department of Homeland Security
