Dear Chair Gelser, Vice-Chair Olsen and members of the Senate Human Services Committee:

I write on behalf of Oregon Opportunity Network (Oregon ON), the statewide association of affordable housing and community development nonprofits, to urge your support for HB 2004. We strongly support HB 2004, which would establish a just-cause eviction standard and would enable local jurisdictions to consider enacting a rent stabilization program, should they so choose.

Oregon ON is part of the Stable Homes for Oregon Families coalition, a diverse group of partners who believe that our current laws allowing no-cause evictions and pre-empting any consideration of local rent stabilization, are contributing to the instability and displacement of vulnerable renters in communities across Oregon.

We know you have heard from many landlords voicing concerns about HB 2004. But not all landlords are in opposition to this bill. Our members who own and operate affordable rental housing, are themselves landlords. In addition, our housing authority members work closely with private landlords who rent to folks with Section 8 vouchers.

As landlords, our members understand first-hand the challenges of the landlord-tenant relationship, and the need for a balanced approach that protects the rights of all parties. We strongly believe that tenants need greater protections from the current market, and that the seriousness of the rental housing crisis in communities across Oregon calls for bold action. The bill has received multiple amendments which add even more layers of protection and sideboards to avoid negative impacts on landlords.

We know that a stable, safe place to call home is the key to success in life. Along with other bills on our agenda to increase the supply of rental homes and bolster homeownership opportunity, enacting additional tenant protections is a vital component of the housing solution. We urge your support of HB 2004, and we thank you for your tireless service to Oregon.
