WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Designates the first Saturday of June the Oregon Outdoor Recreation Day to encourage Oregonians and visitors to enjoy the many spectacular outdoor recreation opportunities that the state has to offer. Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

In a 2016 survey completed by Responsive Management for the Task Force on Funding for Fish, Wildlife, and Related Outdoor Recreation and Education, over 60 percent of Oregonians surveyed report engaging in at least one outdoor activity in the preceding 12 months. These activities include visiting a state or national park, hiking, camping, wildlife viewing, biking, and hunting.
