RE: House Bill 2251

Chair Prozanski and members of the Senate Judiciary Committee, I am Elizabeth Craig, Communications Administrator for the Oregon Department of Corrections (DOC). I am here to testify in support of HB 2251.

What the Bill Does:

House Bill 2251 ensures any person under the age of 18 cannot be incarcerated in a DOC institution.

Background Information:

Research indicates that trying youth as adults in the criminal justice system and exposing them to the adult correctional system makes them more likely to commit future crimes and puts their safety and wellbeing at risk. Through agreement and longstanding practice, youth under the age of 18 are housed at the Oregon Youth Authority (OYA), and are not housed at DOC to prevent exposure to adult offenders.

Through HB 3183 (2013) and HB 4037 (2014), youthful offenders are transported directly to OYA, bypassing DOC's Intake Center. To ensure that both agencies remain committed to best practices for youth now and in the future, statutory amendments are needed.

Additionally, these amendments are necessary to ensure continued compliance with the sight and sound requirements of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act.

Issues Addressed by the Bill:

This bill modernizes statutory language to accurately reflect the current practices of the department. Codifying this practice will ensure continued compliance with the Prison Rape Elimination Act and the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act.

For the reasons stated above, the DOC supports HB 2251, and encourages the committee to vote HB 2251 out of committee with a do pass recommendation.
