## Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate Statewide Course Credit Policy for 2017-2018

The Statewide Advanced Placement Policy was adopted per Senate Bill 342 in 2005, and updated each year since (to reflect changes to the AP curricula). The Statewide International Baccalaureate Policy was adopted in January 2010 and first updated in 2014. Each year, the Statewide AP/IB Workgroup reviews the policy in light of curricular changes. Faculty from the Oregon public university and community college campuses review the curricular changes and provide input for the statewide policy. Members of the Statewide AP/IB Workgroup are listed on the next page.

## Advanced Placement (AP):

- The College Board develops copyrighted materials and examinations
- In Oregon: 38 AP subjects offered in 286 high schools
- Typically, a score of 3 or higher (out of 5) is considered satisfactory
- In 2016, 19,839 students took an AP Exam in Oregon (total of 31,867 exams)
- In 2016, 12,191 students in Oregon scored a 3 or higher on at least one exam (or 61\%)


## International Baccalaureate (IB):

- The IB authorizes schools to offer an IB Diploma Programme to students aged 16-19. The IB oversees the curricula and produces examinations for the IB courses
- In Oregon: 17 high schools offer IB Courses in the IB Diploma Programme
- The courses (and, hence, grades) are separated into a Standard Level and a Higher Level. Typically, a score of 5 or above (out of 7 ) is considered satisfactory
- In 2016, there were 628 students; in 1,102 courses, earning 525 IB Diplomas in Oregon.

## AP Policy Highlights

A new course, Computer Science Principles was reviewed. Credit will be awarded for an exam score of 4 or higher in the amount of one course, from 3 to 5 credits depending on the institution.

## IB Policy Highlights

There were three IB subjects reviewed during the 2016-2017 academic year. One school based syllabus course was reviewed: Astronomy. Astronomy was added to the statewide policy, and credit will be awarded for a grade of 5 or higher at the standard level. Two revised IB courses were reviewed: Global Politics, and Sports, Exercise, \& Health Science. The credit award remains the same; one course for standard level, and two courses at higher level grade of 5 or above.

The following pages present the Statewide AP/IB Policy for the 2017-2018 academic year, and represent consensus among Oregon public institutions on minimum scores and transferrable credits. The subjects that were reviewed for 2017-2018 are highlighted with yellow in the electronic document.
